The BSc Nursing Course at MIMS College of Nursing is designed to prepare graduates to assume responsibilities as professionally competent nurses and midwives in providing promotive, preventive, curative and rehabilitative services. On par with the Indian Nursing Council and Kerala University of Health Sciences, the college prepares its own curriculum structure to inculcate the Mission of the College-"COMPASSIONATE NURSES FOR A CARING PROFESSION". This mission is integrated in to the vertical and horizontal strands of the curriculum and also in hidden curriculum to take out the depersonalizing effect of high-tech nursing care.

Eligibility/Admission Requirements

The minimum age for admission shall be 17 years on or before 31st December 2024 of the year of admission

The minimum educational requirements shall be the passing of Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (12 years course), or Senior School Certificate Examination (10 + 2), or An equivalent with 12 years schooling from a recognized board or university with Sciences (Physics, Chemistry, Biology) and English with minimum of 50% aggregate marks.

Candidate shall be medically fit.

As per Government of Kerala norms and statutory bodies the admission will be 50% Government Quota (40 Seats) and 35% Management Quota (28 Seats), and 15 % NRI Quota (12 Seats)

If there is no NRIs to take up the seats it will be filled from management quota itself.

Eligibility for Admission

Academic:

(I) Candidates who have passed Higher Secondary Examination of the Board of Higher Secondary Education of Kerala or equivalent examinations recognized by any of the Universities in the State of Kerala with Aggregate of 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry, Biology and 50% marks in English in second year only are eligible for admission.

Relaxation in marks:-

Candidates belonging to SEBC (Socially and Educationally Backward Classes) in the State of Kerala with total annual family income up to Rs.6 lakhs will have relaxation of 5% marks. The Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates in the state of Kerala need only a pass in the qualifying examination. (For Government Quota only)

Those candidates claiming relaxation of marks shall produce necessary certificates from the authority concerned. There will be no reservation of seats for SEBC and or SC/ST candidates under Management quota.

Eligibility Certificates: Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from places other than State of Kerala shall produce the certificate of recognition and equivalency of qualifying examination from Kerala University of Health Sciences. (KUHS)Thrissur. This should be furnished at the time of interview for admission.

Age:

Applicants should have completed 17 years of age on the 31st December 2024. No relaxation of the minimum age will be allowed.

Self-attested copy of relevant page of school record namely SSLC/ICSE/CBSE/ certificate showing the date of birth/copy of birth certificate should be produced at the time of admission.

How to Apply.

Application for admission to course B.Sc. Nursing can be registered only online through a single application. The provision for applying online is available at the website. Submission of more than one application by a candidate will lead to rejection of the applications for the same course submitted subsequent to the first application.

Application Fee:

The application fee will be Rs.1000/- for all candidates, payable through Bank Transfer (NEFT/RTGS).

Application submission will be completed only after successful payment of Application fee.

Application fee once remitted will not be refunded in any circumstances.

Availability of Prospectus

(i) Prospectus can also be downloaded from www.mimscon.com. However, it will be available by post or from the office of the MIMS College of Nursing on payment of required fee.

Remittance of Application Fee and Submission of Application Form

There will be three stages for the submission of Application form and all stages are mandatory. Candidates shall complete all the stages of submission as per the time schedule which will be notified through the website/media.

Stage1-Entering candidate details online (registration) and creating a login id and password.

Stage 2-Online Payment of Application fee using Credit/Debit/Internet Banking facility.

Stage3- Completion of Application and submission to the college through online. No need to send any print out f the data to the College office.

Remittance of Application Fee and Submission of Application in detail.

Candidate shall visit the official website aster mimsacademy.com and click the Menu/Navigating Link "Admission" and select UG Programmes.

Instructions on how to apply is given in detail in this area.

Intake and Selection:

Out of the total seats 35% seats (28 Seats) will be filled as management quota seats from the applications received by the College on the basis of merit list prepared based on the marks obtained in the qualifying examination (second year) in the core subjects (Physics, Chemistry, Biology, English) as mentioned in the eligibility criteria.

Out of the total seats 15% seats (12 Seats) shall be filled up from qualified students as per G.O (MS) No.243/2014/HRFWD dated 6.08.2014 of Govt. of Kerala. The original documents shall be submitted at the time of admission.

Preparation of Merit List:

Ranklist will be prepared on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination in Physics Chemistry Biology English (Second year Only).

For CBSE/ICSE Candidates, 10% of the total mark obtained in the in-Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English Subjects will be added to the actual marks subject to a maximum of 90% for the candidate. **Example:**

10% of obtained marks = 31.5

Total = 315 + 31.5 = 346.5

PCBE% = (346.5/400) *100 = 86.625%

Resolution of tie while ranking:

In the case of a tie in the total marks, the marks in Biology will count.

If there is still a tie the marks in Chemistry and Physics will be counted. If a tie till exists, the age of the candidate will be considered, the elder will be preferred to the younger.

Validity of the merit list: The published merit list will be valid till the date up to which the merit list shall be kept alive in terms of instruction/direction of competent authority. Inclusion in the merit list will not entitle the applicant eligible for admission to the course, unless the applicant satisfies the rules regarding the eligibility for admission and other conditions as laid down in the Prospectus.

Furnishing of false information/particulars would result in the forfeiture of the candidature as well as cancellation of admission to the course, and in addition, will attract the relevant provisions of criminal law of the land.

Admission & Payment of Fees

The selected candidates will be informed through SMS in to the registered mobile number or email address.

The students shall pay all fees of the 1st year of the course at the time of admission which will not be refunded at any circumstances.

Fee stipulated by the Fee Regulatory Committee/Govt. of Kerala is applicable along with other fees is applicable. The fee structure will be available from office of the college.

Management Quota

Tuition Fees: Rs 73,025/- Special fees: Rs 23,300/- Caution deposit: Rs 10,000/-

NRI Quota

Tuition Fees: Rs 95,000/- Special fees: Rs 23,300/- Caution deposit: Rs 10,000/-

*If any candidate discontinues the course, after closing of admission as notified by the authority, the candidate has to pay the full fee of the remaining course (4 yrs). Transfer Certificate will be issued only after payment of the above amount.

Also, Legal proceedings will be initiated against student/parent for realization of full amount offes.

Special Instructions.

Ragging: Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in MIMS College of Nursing. Hence any student who indulges in any form of ragging will be subjected to penal action as per provisions of law. Duration of the program: 8 Semesters (4 years)

Duration of the B.Sc. Nursing course shall be four years, which is a credit and semester-based program, comprising of eight semesters including Internship. The maximum period to complete the B.Sc. Nursing course successfully shall not exceed twice the actual duration of the Course (Eight years).

Grading of Performance

Based on the performance, each student shall be awarded a final grade at the end of the semester for each course/subject. Absolute grading is used by converting the marks to grade, based on predetermined class intervals.

UGC 10 point grading system is used with pass grade modified.

A Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) shall be computed up to three decimals as the weighted average of these grade points obtained in all courses by the student during the semester excluding English and electives. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be computed up to three decimals as the weighted average of these SGPA obtained in all semesters by the student during the Course period. SGPA and CGPA are indicated in final grade in mark list/ transcript showing grades of all 8 semesters and their courses/subjects.

Declaration of Pass

- ❖ A first class with distinction is awarded to all candidates who scored a CGPA of 7.500 and above.
- ❖ A First class is awarded to all candidates who scored a CGPA of 6.000 to 7.499 and above.
- ❖ A Second class is awarded to all candidates who scored a CGPA of 5.000 to 5.999 and above.
- CGPA shall be reflected as failed for a student in case of failure, till he/ she passed the subject.

First Class/ Distinction may be awarded irrespective of whether the candidate has appeared for regular/ supplementary examinations. Ranks shall be awarded on the basis of Final CGPA and aggregate of marks.

EXAMINATIONS

Eligibility to Appear for Examinations

1. A candidate must have a minimum of 80% attendance in theory and practical in each course / subject for appearing for University Examination. A minimum of 80% attendance in all the non-exam going subjects in the concerned semester also is essential for registering a candidate for the university examination.

Condonation of Shortage Attendance

There is no provision for condonation of shortage of attendance for B.Sc. Nursing programme.

- As per gazetted regulation the shortage of attendance cannot be condoned for B.Sc. Nursing programme and 80% attendance for both theory and practical separately required for appearing University examination.
- ❖ A candidate must have 100% attendance in each of the practical areas before award of Degree.
- ❖ The candidate must secure 50% marks for internal assessment in theory and practical, wherever is applicable in order to be eligible to appear in the university examination of the subject. Minimum pass mark shall be 40% for Communicative English and Elective modules.
- ❖ The candidate shall appear for University examinations at the end of each semester:
- The candidate shall have cleared all the previous University examinations before appearing for University examinations at the end of fifth semester and before appearing for University examinations at the end of Seventh semester. However, the candidates shall be permitted to attend the consecutive semesters.
- The candidate should clear all the previous examinations before appearing for final Semester / (Eighth Semester) examination.
- The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years.
- ❖ The Principal / Head of the institution shall submit Attendance Certificate of eligible candidates at the time of registration for examinations in each semester.

Schedule of Regular / Supplementary Examination

- ❖ Examinations shall be conducted as per the schedule approved by the Board of Examinations.
- Regular University examinations will be conducted at the end of each Semester.
- Supplementary examinations shall be conducted along with the End Semester University examinations. However, for ensuring the supplementary chances for failed students, University examinations of different subjects shall not be scheduled on the same date.
- ❖ A student who failed in a subject/ subjects may be permitted to reappear in the subsequent end semester university examination.

Scheme of Examination showing maximum and minimum marks

- Candidate who has secured a minimum of 50% marks in theory (for internal and university examination separately) and 50% marks in practical (for internal and university examination separately) in a subject, shall be declared to have passed in that subject.
- Candidate who has secured a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate in a Subject/ paper having more than one Sections shall be declared to have passed in all the concerned Sections of that subject/ paper.
- A minimum of 40% marks shall be the pass mark in Internal / College examination for Communicative English and Elective modules.
- A candidate failing in either theory or practical of a subject has to reappear for both theory and practical of that subject.
- A candidate who passed all the subjects (including theory and Practical) from Semester I to semester VIII and completed 80% of attendance in theory and 100% of Attendance in practical in each subject shall be declared to have passed the BSc Nursing

Course of study

❖ All the regulations stipulated by the university and statutory councils will be followed for the examination and declaration of results.

Regulations related to academics

- 1. No Candidate shall be admitted to any part of the examination unless he / she has secured a minimum of 80% or above attendance separately in theory classes as well as practical in each subject.
- 2. A candidate who is absent for a total of more than 60 days continuous or interrupted within a period of three-months during an academic year shall not be eligible to continue the course with the same batch of students. He / she may obtain special sanction for readmission with the junior batch from higher authorities (University/DME/Govt.of Kerala).

- 3. A candidate must have minimum 80% attendance in both theory and practical separately in each subject for appearing the university examinations.
- 4. Candidates who fail to appear for examination in any part or parts owing to the shortage of required attendance shall make up the lost attendance before appearing for the succeeding examination.
- 5. If the shortage is beyond the condonable limit the candidate should repeat with the junior batch.
- 6. Minimum pass marks shall be 50% in each of the Theory and Practical papers separately for internal examinations.
- 7. The internal marks shall be signed by the candidate before transmission to the University.
- 8. Minimum pass marks shall be 50% in each of the Theory and Practical papers separately for university examinations.
- 9. A candidate must have 100 % attendance in each of the practical areas before award of degree
- 10. A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper.
- 11. If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper he/she has to re appear for both the papers (theory and Practical)
- 12. A candidate who fails in any paper or part in the examination may appear for that paper or part in the subsequent examination.
- 13. Maximum number of attempts permitted for each paper is 3 including first attempt
- 14. Candidate shall not be admitted to the subsequent higher examination unless the candidate has passed the previous examination
- 15. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years.
- 16. Maximum number of candidates for practical examination should not exceeds 15 perday.
- 17. Rank in the examination: Aggregate marks of all the 4 years regular examination shall be considered for awarding rank for the B.Sc. Nursing. A consolidated mark list consisting of all 4-year examinations shall be given to all the students.
